Comments: South Park High School (1914-1915) was designed by Green & Wicks, architects. Semi-fireproof construction, brick walls, tile & concrete floors & roof. Courtyards flank the auditorium in the center of the structure. An addition to the gymnasium and a natatorium designed by Daniel G. McNeil were built in 1934-1935. The school is located in the central, eastern section of the Triangle Neighborhood. It is one of the most significant architectural works in the neighborhood.

Comments: The firehouse was constructed in 1907 with design plans from Howard L. Beck, architect. It is located on the northeast corner of Southside Parkway and Mesmer Avenue, in the eastern central section of the Triangle Neighborhood.
